Reflections with Pastor Scott

Well Done Good and Faithful Servant



Many of you have learned by now that long time member, Marion Erickson, has moved to the Mukilteo area to a living situation that best suits where she finds herself at this time in her life. While I knew this day was coming after she has faced several health challenges over the last few years, I still found great sadness in my heart after learning this news. I am truly going to miss her. And yet, I find myself smiling, giving thanks and seeing the verse in my head from Matthew 25 in the parable of the talents, "Well done good and faithful servant."

Marion was the dedicated leader of the quilting group here at CLC for many years. Not only did she make sure the weekly quilting group gathered, she was constantly out in the community gathering donated materials or getting great deals on materials used for quilting. By doing all this, she made many people in the area aware of what the quilting group at CLC was doing to respond to needs around the world and in our own community. She gave these folks an opportunity to be a part of that ministry whether they attended CLC, came to quilting on Monday's or not. She also helped provide a place for women to gather and use their gifts of time and servant hearts to make a real impact on people's lives. (men could have come too) Marion's own servant heart has impacted thousands of people's lives over the years out of this act of service. Yes, I said thousands, because it not only affected those who came to help, but the community people from which she gathered the materials and those who received the quilts and care kits around the world.

What you do matters and has a larger impact on people's lives than we often think it does. Those who set up the altar for communion allow people every week to receive the greatest gift of grace any of us can receive in the bread and wine, Christ's body and blood, in Holy Communion. We never gather having received communion without having received God's grace. Greeters and ushers, you are often the first people someone who comes through the doors will meet. Your hospitality can set the tone for a positive worship experience and help during the actual worship experience to be one of comfort and ease. You who help put the Dove newsletter together help keep people near and far connected to the ministries of CLC and opportunities for living out one's faith in a response of service in one form or another.

There are many other gifts that people offer that I could list here, but I hope you get the picture. We don't often think that what we do is that big of a deal or wonder if it makes a difference. As a pastor I find moments with these very thoughts. The fact is, and Marion is an example of this, it does make a difference whether we see it first hand or not. So, thank you, not only to Marion for living out her faith in a tangible way, but to each of you who are a part of the CLC community that offer your gifts, no matter how small you think they are, for the mission and ministry of CLC. You are bearing the hands and feet of God to real people in an often-weary world.

From the Bishop:

JULY & AUGUST 2024

Martin Luther writes in the Small Catechism:

What then does 'daily bread' mean? Everything included in the necessities and nourishment for our bodies, such as food, drink, clothing, shoes, house, farm, field, livestock, money, property, an upright spouse, upright children, upright members of the household, upright and faithful rulers, good government, good weather, peace, health, decency, honor, good friends, faithful neighbors, and the like. (Small Catechism, Fourth Petition of the Lord's Prayer)

In May, the six bishops of Region One (this includes the synods of Northwest Washington, Southwestern Washington, Alaska, Oregon, Northwest Intermountain, and Montana) were asked by the Region One hunger teams to write a joint letter requesting Congress to re-authorize the federal Farm Bill and to not cut important funding. The six bishops agreed to write this letter. After it

was written and signed, the ELCA Advocacy staff in Washington, DC hand-delivered it to the House and Senate Agriculture Committees' leaderships and to the Representatives in each of the synod's respective states.

In June, there was a zoom event for all the Lutherans in the six synods to learn more about the Farm Bill and advocate for its continuation. This event was sponsored by the Region One hunger ministry teams, ELCA Advocacy, and Faith Action Network (FAN). Different speakers shared information, conversation happened, and the opportunity to write letters to legislators occurred.

As you might know, the six synods have over 560 congregations and tens of thousands of Lutherans from the states of Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Washington, and Wyoming. These synods and states are not homogenous. The bishops are not homogenous. The congregations within each synod are not homogenous. The members of these congregations are not homogenous. We have differences of opinion at times, we have different priorities, we vote differently, we even shake our heads at things that don't make sense to us about one another.

And yet, in our diversity, we are also joined in the unity of Christ and the promises we have received. Deep in our bones, we know that we are saved by grace through faith. We hold fast to the truth that God loves us no matter what. We know this and trust this and hold this. And, because of this, together we are called out into the world – as followers of Jesus and as civic members of society.

We join together – over and over – to bring about change and protect the vulnerable. We come together beyond political difference because of what we have been promised and what we are called to do and to be. The example I've been using in this article is the Farm Bill. When we advocate for this bi-partisan Farm Bill, we are advocating for farmers, migrants, agricultural workers, Indigenous peoples, hungry children, the inclusion of those who have been historically excluded, and more.

But, of course, we come together far beyond this Farm Bill. We come together because God calls us to love others as God loves us. We work together for a just society. As German pastor and theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote, "Mere waiting and looking on is not Christian behavior. Christians are called to compassion and action, not in the first place by their own sufferings, but by the sufferings of their brothers and sisters, for whose sake Christ suffered." (*A Testament to Freedom*)

I am thankful and proud to be Lutheran because of all of you who feed and clothe, nourish and shelter, love and protect those who are the most vulnerable in this country and this world. It would take pages to list all the ways that you do this individually, in your congregations, in the synod, and in the wider church. Thank you for your advocacy and your care. There is, of course, more work to be done. And so let us together work towards the day when all may receive "daily bread."

Special Feature: Young Adults in Global Mission from our synod

Every year the ELCA provides a number of young adults the opportunity to grow in their faith and work hand in hand with our global companions through the ELCA's Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM) program. These volunteers, who range in age from 21 to 29, take the plunge into a life-changing, yearlong journey in communities around the world. The YAGM program invites young adults into an international year of service supporting the ministries and projects of our global companions. It also invites volunteers into a journey of self-reflection, providing them with space to consider their own identity, God's work in the world and their place within it all.

Young adults serve in the spirit of accompaniment, walking alongside global companions in a manner that practices mutuality, interdependence and solidarity. Areas of service include, but are not limited to, health and human rights, education, environmental justice, professional support and congregational ministry. All site placements provide opportunities for young adults to confront issues of wealth and poverty, racial privilege, gender privilege, economic disparity and globalization, all through the lens of faith.

Each volunteer commits to raising \$6,000 to support their year of service, and other contributors to the ELCA help to support the remaining program \$10,000 per young adult. The total amount of \$18,000 is the average cost per YAGM volunteer, which covers all expenses associated with their service.

As these young adult leaders prepare to head out for their year of service in August, please consider how you and your congregation can support these YAGM volunteers from our synod, financially and otherwise!
