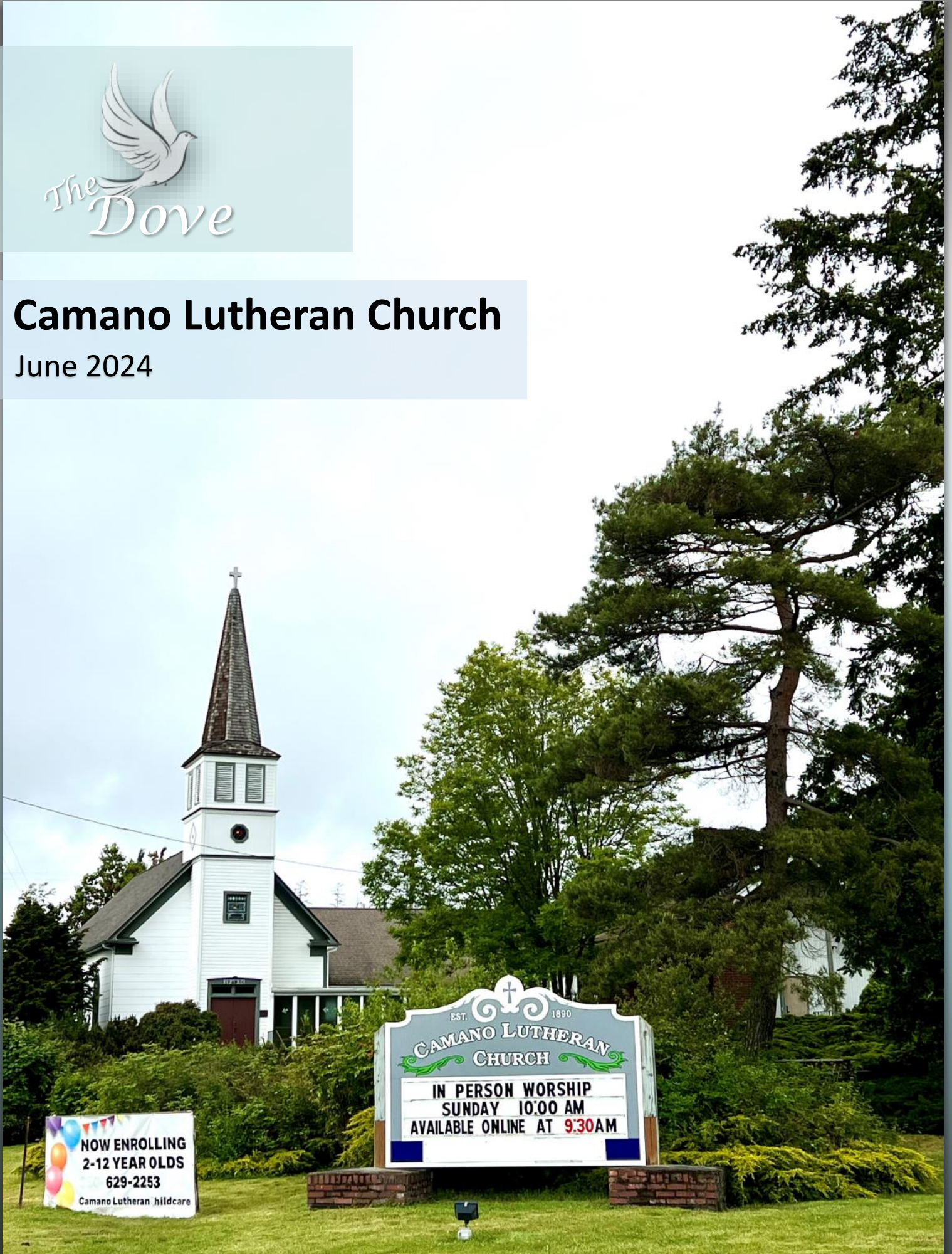

Reflections with Pastor Scott



I'm not Religious but...

I mentioned it briefly in my Pentecost sermon, but the one line I heard again and again from various people from around the world while we were in Greece was, "I'm not religious, but..." As we see our churches struggle with declines in attendance, volunteers less plentiful and a sense that the world doesn't care much about religion anymore, it would be easy to give up hope. I know I have certainly had such moments when I have wondered if this is it for the church as we know it.

In some ways I do think this is it for the church "as we have known it." Notice I said, "as we have known it." I did not say it is the end of the church. It seems in history around every 500 years there is a big reformation or some sort in the world. We know this well. Each year we celebrate Reformation Sunday, which was about, you guessed it, 500 years ago. So, when I hear folks say, "I am not religious but...", I hear hopeful words. Hopeful because I am still sensing in many of those folks a respect or appreciation for, perhaps even curiosity for the divine in our world. This is where I believe God will do God's work, in the place of curiosity and maybes. I just wonder if we are willing to be a part of it or if we are going to remain in our grief over the church we've lost and so dearly loved?

Now I am not exactly sure what God has planned, but I know the gospel message is the heart of it. On Pentecost, God was doing a new thing, and that new thing is why we are here today. We are here today because many of those gathered on that first Pentecost took seriously the invitation to share the good news of Christ life, death and resurrection. Today, just as in Jesus' day, there were those who didn't believe in Jesus as messiah, had been hurt by the church in one way or another and those who are curious about God and God's movement in the world. These are all opportunities for us to share what God has done in our lives and live out our baptismal calling to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and striving for justice and peace in all the earth as described in our ELW (Evangelical Lutheran Worship Hymnal).

Our journey of faith continues, and we trust God's Spirit will lead us. Together we can confidently pray, *"O Lord God who has called us, your servants, to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us. Through Jesus Christ our Lord Amen"*

Synod Assembly Recap

The Synod Assembly held on May 18, 2024, was attended by a total of 337 synod members including 275 voting members, six observers, and 56 visitors/volunteers. We give thanks to our host congregation, Grace Lutheran Church in Des Moines, to all who assisted in the planning and leadership of the day, and to all the attendees.

We began our time together in worship – centered on our theme, “We Lift Our Eyes” – from Psalm 121. It was a joy-filled service with special music from Grace Lutheran Church Music Director, Amy Boers, the GLC Choir, and members of the Mariachi Club from Pacific Lutheran University. During the service, we officially installed Rev. Judy Brennan as our Director for Evangelical Mission. We are grateful that we received over \$5600 in offering that will be shared between Lutheran Community Services Northwest (LCSNW), Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR), and the NW Washington Synod Bishop’s Caring Fund (supports rostered leaders by providing scholarships and emergency aid). THANK YOU for your generosity!

Assembly business items included approving the recommended changes to our synod constitution that were forwarded from the 2022 ELCA Churchwide Assembly and the 2025 Synod Budget. The presented budget was amended to include increased compensation for our rostered synod staff members so that they would receive synod guidelines. (A note from the bishop: while this budget approval is an affirming sign and appreciated, it also calls for increased mission support from our congregations. Please encourage your congregation leaders to prayerfully consider increasing your congregation’s mission support this year.)

Following Synod Council approval, the assembly joyfully received our newest congregation, Hope Church in Lake Stevens. Originally a Covenant Congregation, they left that denomination and began exploring what it would mean to become an ELCA congregation. They began renting from Holy Cross Lutheran in Lake Stevens and had many conversations about what it might mean to do ministry together. Although that partnership never came to fruition, through those discussions Hope discerned a call to stay in Lake Stevens and become an ELCA congregation.

In addition to the written reports shared ahead of the assembly, we received oral reports from our Synod Officers: Bishop Shelley Bryan Wee, Vice President Kay Edgerton, Treasurer Bart Brosten, and Synod Secretary Rev. Netsie Griffith. These reports are posted on our assembly webpage:

Additionally, we shared video reports and stories from Ministry Partners and Synod Committees. You will find these – and written reports received – also posted on our assembly webpage. Look for a link to view a recording of the full assembly to be posted on the synod website to be posted soon.

A handful of synod members donned fun flame headbands to share stories of how the Spirit is working in our synod in new or surprising ways. We heard about a group of youth ministry leaders joining forces to offer opportunities for their young people; how one congregation is being transformed by the welcome and inclusion of Spanish-speaking neighbors; how another congregation challenged themselves to learn more about what it means to welcome and support a leader of color; how one cluster of congregations is collaborating to support one another in new ways; and how a passion for archery is creating a new sacred space. APRIL 2024 NOTES FROM THE PROPERTY MAINTENANCE TEAM

It has been a busy spring. Thanks to our mowing crew and new team members John Leque and Jay Whitford, we are getting the work done each week. We are also thankful to “retired” crew member Dale Johnson for seeing that our two riding mowers were repaired and back in service.

You may have noticed how good Pioneer Hall is looking. The painters from D.J. Hopkins have been great to work with. There is still some touch up and clean-up work that they have promised to do for us. We now have a new dusk-to-dawn area light on the north end of Pioneer Hall.

Our stage crew set up and took down the stage for the Pre School spring program.

I met with the technician from Pye-Barker for the bi-annual check of our kitchen cooking area fire suppression system.

Sadly, as we found a large broken window in the Fellowship Hall. We are in the process of getting a bid to have the window replaced. Fortunately, only the outer pane of the double pane window is broken so we are not exposed to the weather.

The lock to the Child Care building quit working and is being repaired by the locksmith.

Funding for an upgrade of a fire alarm system to meet new licensing requirements was made available from the state of Washington’s community investment budget. Work on the system could start this summer. All the buildings will be linked into one monitored system.

Correcting the issues with our water system is not happening quickly. Having an engineer plan a filtration system to meet state requirements appears to be a 6+ month process. Child Care is providing bottled water for drinking and cooking; Pre School is out till fall. The manganese level does not present an urgent health concern for adults when we have a cup of coffee at church each week, but we are obligated to make the correction.

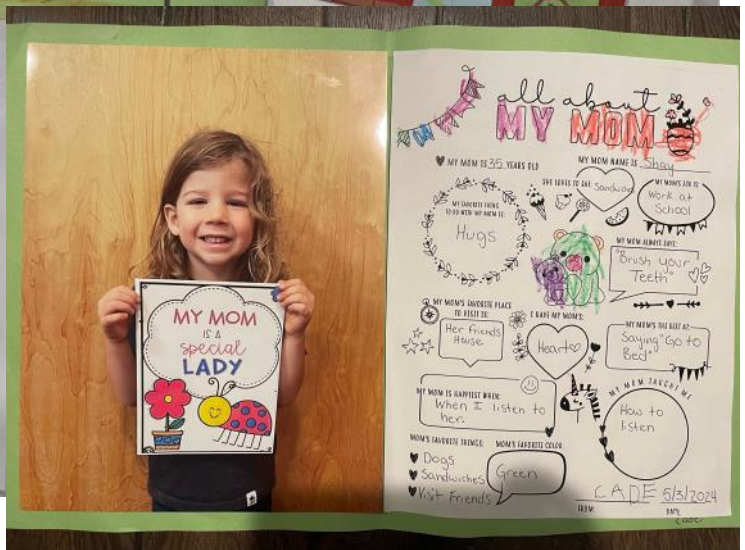
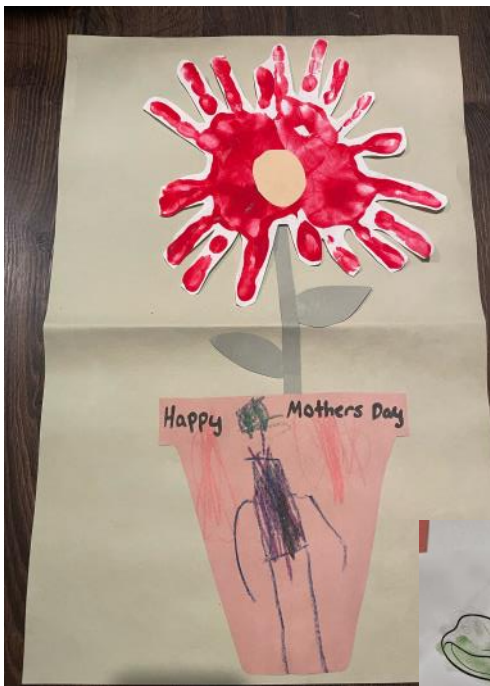
The Fire Alarm System will be installed in June. It has taken a very long time to get to this point. Thank you to those who worked tirelessly to make this happen.
